The Canaveral Press edition of the two novelettes featured eight illustrations by the talented Reed Crandall, who had previously illustrated Tarzan and the Madman. Reed went on to execute illustrations for new Canaveral Press printings of The Gods of Mars, A Fighting Man of Mars, Swords of Mars, and The Moon Maid. However these new editions were never published, although Reed's illustrations were eventually printed in a variety of other publications such as Witzend, ERB-dom, and The Edgar Rice Burroughs Library of Illustration.

It should be noted that the first edition, first printing of John Carter of Mars is bound in dark blue cloth with the title erroneously stated on the front board and spine as John Carter and the Giant of Mars in black letters.

It is hoped that future editions of John Carter of Mars will acknowledge the authorship of "John Carter and the Giant of Mars" as being the work of Jane Ralston Burroughs and John Coleman Burroughs.
